## HIGHLIGHTS

In addition to a fun, informative, entertaining, and interactive celebration of cultural diversity, celebrAsian also contributes significantly to the quality of life in Central Iowa. It has become a premier cultural destination that draws visitors from across the Midwest and beyond. This year's theme - "Rooted in the East, blooming in the West" - reflects both pride in our cultural heritage and the optimistic pursuit of our vision of an Iowa where Asian-Americans are an integral part of a vibrant and prosperous community of diverse people. The theme provided the inspiration for the largest and most diverse array of offerings in the six year history of this event:

- From the Goddess in the Nepalese village to the interactive displays in the Cambodian Village featuring children in that community, twelve Asian villages presented their communities through crafts, history, art, gifts, and food. Villages include: Burmese, Cambodian, Chinese, Filipino, Indian, Japanese, Korean. Laos, Nepalese, Taidam, Vietnamese, and Thai.
- The Diplomacy Village featured government and non-profit organizations dedicated to connecting Iowa to the world and promoting international relations with Asia.
- Sports enthusiasts participated in volleyball and sipa competitions while friends and family cheered them on. Warrior spirit was unleashed at the Iowa Marital Arts demonstrations and competition.
- Energetic young men from the Indian community stole the show to become the "Next Sens Asian," demonstrating that traditional cultural performances can be sensational and engaging.
- The annual fashion show highlighted traditional clothing alongside current trends.
- Festival-goers were enticed by the many flavors of Pan-Asian cuisine as they savored both traditional dishes and contemporary fusion fare.
- Young festival goers enjoyed celebrating the Year of the Rat at the Children's Activities Village where children of all ages engaged in interactive activities and crafts.
- With an emphasis on healthy eating, the Health and Wellness Village provided full health screenings and information as well as demonstrations on the health benefits of pet therapy and acupuncture.

- In an exploration of identity, place, and culture, nine Iowa artists debuted original works of art at the IAsian Fine Arts Pavilion. The artists were mentored by internationally renowned Filipino artist, Jon Cuyson.

   National headliners Tatum Jones and Magnetic North shared the stage with local talent Gimmik, Jade Lea, and Larry Berenguel, while our Asian communities showcased traditional and cultural performances.
- "Next InspirAsian" featured the original designs of creative Asian fashion designers.
- Professional chef, Penn Hongthong, demonstrated the art of Lao cooking while others put their culinary skills to the test in the Cravin' Asian cooking competition.
- Over eighty individuals became part of the festivities by competing in the inaugural Martial arts tournament.
